## Selective Municipal Waste Collection Point **PSZOK**

Residents living in the Kobierzyce Municipality, as part of the municipal waste management fee, may dispose of the following types of waste at the PSZOK free of charge:



Bio-waste



Used electrical and electronic equipment



Furniture and bulky waste



Expired medicines and chemicals



Used car tires (passenger vehicles only)



Used batteries and accumulators



Construction and demolition waste



Plastic waste



Textiles

At the PSZOK, we accept only waste generated within the Kobierzyce Municipality that does not originate from business activity

Limits: Construction and demolition waste: up to 1000 kg per household per year Car tires: up to 8 units per household per year

The PSZOK does not accept: Tractor tires, Passenger car tires in quantities that indicate commercial or business origin

Construction and demolition waste must be delivered in a selective manner, separated into the following categories:

- Concrete and brick rubble
- Ceramic waste and interior fittings (e.g. sanitary ware, fixtures, etc.)
- Wood (e.g. door frames, doors, window frames, parquet flooring, wall paneling, etc.)



### Duties of Residents of the Kobierzyce Municipality



### Duties of PSZOK Personnel



- Identifying the type of delivered waste (only a resident who has not declared a compost bin in the Municipality may dispose of bio-waste)

- Transporting the delivered waste to the location indicated by the staff

- Unloading waste independently and placing it in properly labeled containers or designated areas

- Removing any remaining waste left at the unloading area

- Following the instructions of PSZOK staff, especially regarding movement within the facility

- Complying with safety regulations, especially the prohibition of open flame sources

- Leaving the PSZOK promptly after unloading waste and removing any residual waste from the unloading area

- Verifying the type and quality of the delivered waste, and in the case of construction and demolition waste, also the quantity – to ensure compliance with the regulations

- Directing the person delivering the waste to the designated unloading area

- Keeping the PSZOK area clean and tidy

- Ensuring that waste containers are not overfilled

- Storing waste selectively within the PSZOK area

- Keeping an up-to-date register of waste received at the PSZOK

## Waste is not accepted in the following cases:

- Delivered by an unauthorized person (e.g. not residing within the Kobierzyce Municipality or not paying the municipal waste management fee to the Municipality of Kobierzyce)
- Waste contaminated with asbestos or other hazardous substances
- Waste delivered in a non-selective manner or in a way that indicates lack of proper segregation
- Waste handed over in damaged, unmarked, or unidentifiable packaging
- Waste in quantities indicating a business/commercial origin (e.g. excessive amounts of glass bottles, cardboard, or packaging materials)
- Waste originating from sources other than households (e.g. chemicals not typically used in households: acids, bases, chemical salts, reagents – especially in large quantities)



**In case of refusal to accept waste,** the person delivering the waste is required to immediately take it back and dispose of it in a manner compliant with environmental protection regulations.

## WASTE SEGREGATION RULES

Check which card you will receive for your waste segregation.

Where should you throw away an old notebook?


Jar lids

Are there still plastic bottles or paper in your mixed waste bin?



- By sorting your waste, you're not only saving money – you're also helping the environment.
- Just 35 PET bottles are enough to produce one warm fleece jacket.
- Recycling glass cullet reduces the need for raw materials (like sand, limestone, soda, etc.), saves up to 50% water and around 30% energy. This also means less pollution – each ton of collected glass cullet reduces CO<sub>2</sub> emissions by 220 kg.
- And when it comes to paper: one ton of recycled paper saves 14 trees and can be reused 6 to 7 times before the fibers wear out.

### Required Recycling Levels for Municipal Waste in 2021–2035\*



\*The targets are calculated by weight in relation to the total amount of municipal waste generated within the Municipality. Failure to meet the required levels results in a penalty imposed on the Municipality for each ton below the required threshold.

## DEAR RESIDENT,

### 1 AVOID EXCESSIVE PLASTIC WASTE

- Use reusable shopping bags.
- Reuse plastic items and packaging whenever possible.
- Avoid buying products that are excessively packaged, especially in plastic film.
- Try to replace plastic items with those made from natural materials.
- Use reusable food containers and drink bottles (e.g. glass ones).
- Sort plastic waste carefully to enable full recycling.

### 2 DO NOT DUMP WASTE IN ILLEGAL LOCATIONS SUCH AS FORESTS, CAMPSITES, OR ROADSIDE AREAS

### 3 DO NOT BURN WASTE IN STOVES OR OPEN FIRES

Residents of the Kobierzyce Municipality are required to separate and collect the following types of municipal waste:



In bags and containers

- Bio-waste
- Metals and plastics
- Paper and cardboard
- Glass packaging
- Residual waste



Waste placed in front of the property during organised collections

- Furniture and other bulky waste
- Passenger car tires
- Christmas trees
- Construction and demolition waste
- Used electrical and electronic equipment




Waste accepted by the PSZOK

- Bio-waste
- Used electrical and electronic equipment
- Furniture and other bulky waste
- Expired medicines and chemicals
- Used tires
- Used batteries and accumulators
- Construction and demolition waste
- Plastics
- Paper waste and textiles
- Lamps and light bulbs

Residual waste (leftover after sorting) must be placed in designated containers.

Average morphological composition of mixed waste\* – that is, how much recyclable material can still be separated from mixed waste

\*\* placing paper, glass, plastics, multi-material packaging, or plant-based bio-waste into mixed (residual) waste containers constitutes a violation of selective waste collection rules and is subject to a higher waste management fee

**SORTED, NOT MIXED**

Waste collection takes place between **6:00 AM and 10:00 PM.**



The "Eco Harmonogram" app provides the full collection schedule.

In case of excess waste, it should be placed in a bag and labeled with the type of waste it contains (e.g., paper, plastic, bio, glass). The waste will be collected only if the bag is properly labeled. Loose waste will not be collected.

Twice a year, a mobile collection of tires and bulky waste is carried out within the Municipality.

Waste during the mobile collection of bulky waste and tires is collected only from residents of the Kobierzyce Municipality who pay the municipal waste management fee. Waste originating from business activity will not be accepted.

METALS AND PLASTICS



Put these in the container ✓

- Plastic bottles
- Multi-material packaging (e.g. juice and milk cartons)
- Plastic bags, films, small wrappers, caps and other plastic packaging
- Aluminum and tin cans (e.g. after drinks or canned food)
- Small scrap metal
- Packaging styrofoam (e.g. from electronics and appliances)
- Plastic bottles after cooking oil
- Plastic flower pots
- Plastic packaging from eco-pea coal
- Chips bags
- Sachets and cans from pet food
- Rubber waste
- Disposable dishes
- Disposable razors
- Single-use spice packaging

PAPER



Put these in the container ✓

- Newspapers and catalogues
- Office and school paper
- Paperback books or books with covers removed
- Paper bags
- Cardboard and other paper packaging

GLASS



Put these in the container ✓

- Glass bottles and jars
- Glass food containers
- Glass cosmetic containers (if not made from permanently combined materials)

BIO-WASTE



Put these in the container ✓

- Plant-based food scraps
- Small branches from trees and shrubs
- Coffee grounds and tea leaves
- Grass clippings, leaves, flowers
- Sawdust and tree bark
- Small, untreated wooden items

RESIDUAL WASTE REMAINING AFTER SORTING



Put these in the container ✓

- Waste remaining after sorting
- Disposable diapers and other hygiene products
- Sweepings from cleaning
- Cooled ash
- Pet waste
- Bones and meat scraps
- Broken ceramics

Before throwing away paper and cardboard waste, it's recommended to remove any non-paper elements such as paper clips, staples, fabric covers, or plastic windows from envelopes, etc.



Not sure where it goes? Use the waste finder!

Do not put these in the container ✗

- Bottles and containers with contents inside
- Packaging from engine oils, greases, paints, and varnishes
- Full medicine packages
- Household appliances and electronic equipment (AGD and RTV)
- Construction styrofoam

Do not put these in the container ✗

- Tissues
- Foil-lined, thermal, or fax paper
- Drink cartons (e.g. juice, milk)
- Disposable diapers and other hygiene products
- Wallpaper

Do not put these in the container ✗

- Table glassware, porcelain, ceramics
- Crystal glass (e.g. decanters, wine glasses)
- Eyeglass lenses, window glass, mirrors
- Light bulbs, screens, and TV lamps

Do not put these in the container ✗

- Ash
- Soil
- Stones
- Meat scraps and bones
- Pet waste

Do not put these in the container ✗

- Paper, glass, metals, and plastics
- **Clothing and textiles**
- Bio-waste
- Used electrical and electronic equipment
- Expired medicines and chemicals
- Batteries and accumulators
- Used oils, operating fluids, and filters
- Light bulbs and fluorescent lamps
